You can also do an internship abroad – ask the International Center! Usually 3 months (full-time) or 6 months (part-time)



#### Focus

### Train trips

**Bayern ticket** (or other regional tickets)

- Starts at 25€, for each additional person 7€ (up to 5 people can share a ticket)
- Valid for a whole day, you can change as many trains as you want

#### **BahnCard**

 You pay once a year and receive discounts for (almost) all train tickets

#### **Popular destinations**

- Regensburg (Danube)
- Füssen (Castle Neuschwanstein)
- Garmisch Partenkirchen (Bavarian Alps)







### Skiing trips

**Our tip:** Check for Combi-Tickets – train ride + ski-lift ticket
