BACHELOR IN MANAGEMENT AND TECHNOLOGY

The Bachelor in Management and Technology is a hybrid study course, combining 70% management with 30% technology studies. It is possible to study the whole program in English by choosing Computer Engineering as your technical specialization.

In general, you should complete 30 credits per semester in order to finish your studies in the regular six semester period.

In the program-specific academic and examination regulation (FPSO) you find details about the study progress and which deadlines should be met.



NICE TO KNOW

The regular time of studying is planned over six semesters,

but the maximum period of study is eight semesters.

MASTER IN MANAGEMENT AND TECHNOLOGY

The core of the program lies within the two areas of Management and Technology. Depending on the specialization you choose, it is possible to study the whole program in English.

In general, you should complete 30 credits per semester to finish your studies in the regular time of four semesters. For more information, see the section: Specialization in Technology.

In the program-specific academic and examination regulation (FPSO) you find details about the study progress and which deadlines should be met.

MASTER IN MANAGEMENT

On the MiM program, you top off your skills in engineering and natural sciences with a management education. The first two semesters contain compulsory basic courses in management, law and economics. In the third semester, you will be able to follow your individual path through your choice of electives. You can choose electives from one area or mix and match electives from several areas.

The program is available up to 100 % in English.

In the program-specific academic and examination regulation (FPSO) you find details about the study progress and which deadlines should be met.

MASTER IN CONSUMER SCIENCE

The Master in Consumer Science combines management studies with social and consumer sciences. The program includes a mandatory Project Studies modules that provide you with hands-on experience.

In general, you should complete 30 credits per semester in order to finish your studies in the regular four semester period.

In the program-specific academic and examination regulation (FPSO) you find details about the study progress and which deadlines should be met.

MASTER IN FINANCE & INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

The Master in Finance and Information Management provides holistic skills and links the fields of financial management, quantitative methods, and information management. The first two semesters contain 12 credits of mandatory courses and courses in a core area. In the third semester, you can choose courses in elective areas.

Some credits can be partially completed at the University of Bayreuth. In the program-specific academic and examination regulation (FPSO) you find details about the study progress and which deadlines should be met.

EXAM REGISTRATION

You can sign up for all exams on TUMonline (www.campus.tum.de) by accessing "Study Status/Curriculum" and selecting the respective subjects, or by using the option "Exam Registration" and searching for the exam manually.

When you sign up for a course, you are not automatically registered for the respective exam as well - you will have to individually sign up for every exam!

Normally, the date from which the exam registration is active will be indicated in each lecture. Each semester, there's a specific time period in which the exam registration is possible, which usually ends on January 15th for the winter semester and on June 30th for the summer semester. But the deadlines can differ for certain exams, so please always check the exam registration period for each module individually in TUMonline. Delayed registrations are not accepted. If you decide not to take an exam that you are registered for, you still have the possibility to deregister within a preassigned time-space. If you don't attend an exam that you are registered for, the exam will be marked as failed with the mark 5.0.

The only exception occurs in case of illness and the submission of a medical certificate attesting to your inability to take part in the examination. This certificate must be issued on the day of the exam and submitted to the Grade Management of TUM SoM immediately.

Retake exams of management courses mostly take place during the exam period of the following semester. The dates of the retake exams are announced in the lecture and in TUMonline, and are listed as a regular exam.

If you are unsure about certain legal regulations, you may contact your **program manager** within the school's administration (School Office). We recommend attending all information sessions that are offered during your studies and read the program specific academic and examination regulations (FPSO).

SERVICES & PEOPLE

In the following, you will get more familiar with the administration of TUM School of Management. Your program manager will help you with your study planning and will answer general questions about your program.

The Grade Management is responsible, among others, for the confirmation of examination results and the recognition of courses from other degree programs (given a form filled by the respective chair). 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SPECIALIZATIONS

SPECIALIZATION IN TECHNOLOGY

To make it easier for you to choose your specialization in technology, we put together some information on each of them.

We distinguish between minor and major studies: the choice between major and minor depends on what technical specialization you had during your Bachelor's.

It is suggested that you have at least 42 ECTS of previous knowledge in the major you want to enroll in.

THE STUDENT COUNCIL OFFERS CONSULTATION FOR EVERY TECHNICAL SPECIALIZATION.

Gain fundamental knowledge about programming, essentials for databases and IT relevant theoretical background. We recommend this specialization if you have good analytical skills, enjoy working on mathematical problems and can solve problems in creative ways. Most minor courses are in German only, but there are several major modules offered in English.

Mechanical Engineering provides a basic theoretical background to developing and constructing mechanical systems. You can choose this specialization if you have a good understanding of Mathematics and are interested in the Automotive Industry or Machinery and Materials. All courses are offered in German only.

For Electrical and Information Technology substantial knowledge of Mathematics is essential, as well as a deep interest in Physics. You will study the fundamentals of Electrical Engineering, expanded by the understanding of basic Informatics and Information and Communication Technology (ICT). You need a good level of German for following this specialization.

Gain insight into the most important chemical methods and fields. You will have introductory courses in organic and inorganic chemistry, as well as lectures on biochemistry and the basics of physical, technical and analytical Chemistry. Get the opportunity to apply your knowledge practically, in a lab course. Very good German is needed, as all modules are in German only. In the chemistry minor, you will have some required modules.

Learn about a wide range of topics related to modern technologies. These courses are offered by the faculties of Electrical Engineering and Informatics, which means that you can choose to learn the fundamentals of electrical circuits, the development of communication networks or multiple programming languages. Courses in Computer Engineering are 100% in English.

This specialization only offers minor courses. Industrial Engineering has many overlaps with the Operations and Supply Chain Management (OSCM) specialization, so you cannot choose it if you already have the OSCM as your Management specialization. There are few courses in the offering, and all of them are in English.

ENERGY MARKETS

For students interested in finance-related topics such as Asset Management, Group Accounting, Management Accounting, and Risk Management. This specialization is suitable both for beginners in financial topics and for advanced students already familiar with basic finance concepts. The majority of the courses are held in English.

Management and Marketing offers a broad spectrum of subjects in different aspects of the three areas. Most courses are seminars with only small groups, which enables great mentoring. Dive deep into the human psyche of leadership, theoretical and practical marketing practices, or strategy development for entities. Most courses are in English, some in German.

Suitable for those who are interested in the manifold areas across a companies' supply chain, such as procurement, production, or logistics and have a strong interest in methodological approaches towards those topics. Enhance your knowledge in the theoretical backgrounds of the modern operations modeling, optimization & simulation. All classes and are held in English. (Recommendation to have prior knowledge)

Interested in starting your own business? Or simply fascinated by innovative practices and methods? Analyzing business models from different perspectives until the very last detail is demanded in the same manner as capturing "the big picture". Classes are often held in English, some in German.

Get to know the basics of Economics and the role of the government within the economy. You will analyze different theoretical models about the countries' participation as well as the impact of different political systems on the economy. Be aware that some lectures are held in German. There is more offer in English now.

You'll find a course offer dealing with Agriculture and Consumer Behavior .Most of the courses are also available in other specializations. There are only a few seminars available at the moment. Most of the courses are in English so you can take this module 100% in English.

For those interested in energy markets. You will gain a basic understanding of why energy markets are a special area and need different approaches compared to other industries. You will also learn about what challenges these markets are facing. At the moment there are only a few seminars available. All courses are in English.

STUDY ABROAD

You have the chance to study abroad with TUMexchange - which offers students of all faculties the possibility for a study-related stay in several countries outside Europe and UK - or with TUM SoMex programs - where TUM SoM cooperates directly with leading business schools and faculties at universities from Europe and the rest of the world.

If you have accepted an exchange place for TUMexchange, you cannot apply for TUM SoMex in the same application period. If you are not selected in the first round for a TUM SoMex program, you can apply again for one of the remaining places via the clearing procedure (in February).

- You studied at least 4 semesters of your bachelor's program before the beginning of your stay at the host university
- Your subject area must be available at the host university – check on the MoveOn database
- Language certificate (see below)

HOW TO APPLY

- You need to prove that you speak the language used for teaching at the partner university. In December, you will receive a confirmation or rejection of your application.

- Apply for a leave of absence, if necessary
- Apply for an external scholarship, if necessary
- Obtain the necessary visas, insurances, vaccination, and book flights

REQUIREMENTS

- You completed 80% of the expected ECTS credit points for your current semester (exceptions can be made if you have valid reasons, bachelor students can apply only from their third semester)
- Due to the corona impact, for the upcoming application period the required credit points have been exceptionally reduced to an average of 18 ECTS per completed semester
- No exchange in the country in which the higher education entrance qualification or bachelor's degree was obtained
- You can participate only once per educational cycle (Bachelor: cycle 1, Master: cycle 2)
- Language certificate (see below)

- Grade Report (Master students with less than 24 ECTS: graduation certificate from your diploma or bachelor's degree, with your GPA)

- Optional: Participation in the buddy for exchange or first year program or participation in the accomodation database.

STUDENT ID

WHAT IS MY STUDENT ID GOOD FOR?

The student ID is a multi-functional chip-card with your photo on it. You can get the Student ID at the matriculation office at the Main Campus. When you receive it for the first time, make sure that all data is correct. It is required for participation in examinations or to access the library/university late at night or on weekends. With the Student ID you can also get discounts in many places. You will also find your personal matriculation number on the front of the card.

VALIDATION

You will need to validate the card each semester - when you receive the card at the beginning of your first semester, it is already valid. You will find machines for validating your card in the matriculation hall at the city campus, as well as at the campus in Garching.

SEMESTER TICKET

On the back of your Student ID, you will find your library number which will give you access to the OPAC (online catalog of the library). You can use this number to reserve books and have them sent to your preferred pick-up location. By default, the password is the first four digits of your birthday (the German version of your date, i.e. DDMM).

With the Student ID you can make cashless payments in the canteen (Mensa), in the cafeterias, and at many snack and drink machines on the entire campus. You can book money on your card at a loading station in the entrance hall of the Mensa or the cafeteria (Stu-Café) near the Audimax.

Mo - Fri, between 6pm - 6am, on weekends and public holidays throughout the day, your Student ID serves as a ticket for the entire public transport network. You can upgrade to a 24/7 ticket for the semester by purchasing an additional semester ticket for 209,30 €. The tickets can be purchased at one of the ticket machines, by entering your matriculation number. More info: www.semesterticket-muenchen.de.

HOW DO I GET ORIENTATION ON CAMPUS?

You can also explore the 360 degree Campus Tour on mgt.tum.de under "Campuses/Munich/Explore the campus".

How to find a room just by its number:

0503

Tells you the floor level the room is located on. Tells you the building the room is located in. Building numbers start with a "1" for the main building and increase going clockwise around the main campus.

Tells you the room number on that floor in that building.



IT SERVICES

You will start using some IT services at TUM already on your first day. This is why it would be a good idea to learn how they work. Here is a short overview of the services you will use most.

TUMonline

Most administrative things during your studies at TUM will be organized through TUMonline. This could be e.g. **registration for your courses** (and thereby getting access to the respective Moodle course) and **registration for the exams** (you have to register separately for these!), **exporting your current transcript of records** or certificate of enrollment, **receiving your grades**, as well as **managing** everything else – like **email addresses** or **getting software licenses** by the TUM. To make it short: it's very important to get used to this tool! The IT department offers instructions on how to use TUMonline, you can browse through their website (www.it.tum.de).

You will constantly be asked for your TUM ID. But what is this actually? You can find your TUM ID by navigating to your start page in TUMonline and then under the resource button "TUM ID". It is structured like "ab12xyz".

Your TUM ID will be, next to your matriculation number, the other unique identifier which identifies you in the TUM community. You also receive your emails via a standardized email address (ab12xyz@mytum.de) and you can log in to almost all the IT services using this ID in combination with your password.

Suggestion: please list your matriculation number in your mails, if you contact the School Office.

ZOOM AND BIG BLUE BUTTON

Both video communications apps are our newest tool to support online teaching. They are platforms for video and audio conferencing, which in our case supports student learning groups, exercises, and seminars. Screen sharing, chats, and polls are included features. Students and employees receive a license with which they can independently conduct meetings.

IT SERVICES

MOODLE

moodle.tum.de

Moodle is the Learning Management System of the TUM. It offers online course rooms for lecturers to provide learning materials as well as many different activities for communication, collaboration, and self-learning. To log into Moodle, you will need your TUM ID and your password (the same you use to log into TUMonline).

LECTURIO

www.lecturio.de

Lecturio is the platform the TUM School of Management uses for recording lectures and providing them to the students. Please be aware that not every lecture is recorded. At the beginning of the semester you can check online if your lecture is recorded. Often, videos are also uploaded on Moodle, Proctorio or even Youtube.

OPAC (ONLINE PUBLIC ACCESS CATALOGUE) opac.ub.tum.de

In the TUM OPAC, you will find all books and journals the TUM library owns - printed and electronic. However, if you want to get access to all the materials which are available at TUM, you should go for OPACplus, which in addition offers you access to all scientific materials the TUM has in electronic format. Just log in with your TUM credentials (ID + password) and you're good to go. All the materials you can find there are categorized and tagged which makes searching through the scientific world way easier. The TUM library also offers a good amount of online trainings to get you used to the searching process.

TUM CAMPUS APP

The Campus App is available on Android and iOS and covers useful information such as the schedule of the U-Bahn closest to your specified campus or today's mealoffering of the canteen. Furthermore, the Room Finder (see above) is integrated in the app, as well as other tools, such as your grade overview, current news from the university, and updates from the TU-Film, a cinema organized in the lecture halls of TUM. Last but not least, configure your eduroam access on your mobile phone through the app.



TUM LIBRARY

The University Library of the Technical University of Munich consists of 10 different Branch Libraries which are located in Munich. Garching, Freising, and Straubing. It will support you during your studies with a wide range of academic sources such as technical literature, academic journals, databases, eBooks, and textbooks. Due to its opening hours until midnight and during the weekends, the library is a popular place for studying and working.

BORROWING AND ORDERING

The library provides you with a comprehensive collection of literature with 1.9 million volumes and five textbook collections. You can find all of the available literature listed within the online catalog. Regarding your study topic, most of the relevant literature can be found at the Branch Library of the Main Campus. As a rule, you may borrow most books for up to four weeks. If the books have not been reserved by another student during this time, the deadline extends to up to five months. There are also books designated as Non-Loan Collection (books with yellow label) and also as Restricted Loan Collection (books with blue label), that cannot be borrowed for long-term use.

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STUDY FINANCING

Do you still need funding for your studies? Here are a couple of ways in which you could finance your studies, from scholarships to jobs.

BAFÖG

BAföG is a financial support for students and pupils with little financial backing from their parents to enable them to study. It consists of two parts: One half you get as an interest-free loan, the other half is actually gifted from the state. No matter how many loans you accumulate over time, it can never be more than 10.000€.

SCHOLARSHIPS

These are a common way of financing the studies. The primary goal of a scholarship is to support talented and committed people, but usually, also those financially in need, and thus to enable or facilitate their education. As a rule, scholarships are awarded based on political, social, and religious criteria and, in particular, on the basis of good academic, school, or sports performance. Your volunteering skills and engagement are also taken into consideration.

Some scholarships are: Deutschlandstipendium, Aelius Förderwerk, Stiftung der Deutschen Wirtschaft, Evangelisches Studienwerk Villigst.

STUDY FUNDS

Study funds are an elegant solution to finance your student life, enabling you to become financially independent from your parents' income.

- Flexible payments: Monthly, semi-annual, etc., Can be combined with BAföG, scholarships and other financial aid
- Income-linked repayment in accordance with individual work and life situations.

An example of a study fund is Deutsche Bildung.

STUDY LOAN

A student loan is a special form of a loan that is not paid out in a total amount but in monthly installments. It is primarily aimed at students who have a financial shortfall in terms of living expenses during their studies due to low or no BAföG entitlement.

JOB

Do you want to gain work experience and earn money at the same time? During your studies, you can opt for a mini-job or a working student position.

These might be different with some student visa.

MINI-JOB

Max. 450€/month Max. 20h/week Tax free No social security contributions

WORKING STUDENT

Max. 20h/week during the semester Max. 40h/week during the semester break Tax allowance of 9.984€/year Studies must be the main focus

The Student Union offers cheap housing for students whose parents do not live in the greater Munich area. Make sure to register early during your studies on the waiting list of up to three of the dorms. It usually takes 3-4 semesters until you receive a spot.

PRIVATE STUDENT HOUSING

Besides the Student Union's dorms, there are several privately held ones in Munich, some of which might be more expensive. Campus Viva, UniApart, Campus Südseite and Studio M are a couple of examples here. You can find other cheaper options on the website of the Student Union, under "Further Accommodation".

OTHER SOURCES

There are several platforms with rental offers on the Internet. However, be aware of possible frauds and never transfer money in advance! The legal procedure only requests you to pay your rent and possibly a deposit after you signed the contract. The standard deposit is commonly three times the monthly rent.

You can also find offers in local newspapers, such as Süddeutsche, Abendzeitung or TZ.

TIPS ON HOW TO FIND OR SECURE ACCOMODATION FASTER

- Send as many e-mails/messages as possible asking to visit the apartment and make sure you follow correspondence etiquette. Note that many landlords receive hundreds of messages and do not reply.
- It may help to include a short paragraph describing yourself and your funding situation many landlords won't even open attached documents if you do not do so.
- Prepare the required documents proofs of income, guarantees and even a CV might increase the landlord's trust in you.
- Make a good impression when you visit the flat bring your documents and ask questions, showing that you are interested in getting the room. Also, smile and be kind.
- Decide quickly when you get a positive response not all your visits will result in an affirmative answer from the landlord. So, when you receive an offer, consider its benefits and downsides and let the owner know about your decision as soon as possible, before they turn to someone else.

1. AUDIMAX
